The Connell F. Smith-Homer Brown Scholarship is awarded to college students whose parents, grandparents, spouse, or who themselves are a member of Local 773. This Award is based on the applicants demonstrated academic excellence, contribution to the community and the promise of continued growth.



Connell F. Smith served as Business Manager and Sec/treasurer of Laborers' Local 773 from 1942 to 1976. It was his vision and leadership that guides Local 773 to this day in organizing, political action, and service to the membership and community. He provided a strong foundation for Local 773 and his philosophy of "Who did I help today" guided him as the longest serving business manager in Local 773 history. Homer Brown was a construction laborer and during his career served as sergeant at arms, executive board and later served as Vice President of 773. He worked during the great depression for 55 cents an hour while raising 6 children. Despite his hardship, Brown and his wife Mary managed to make certain their children obtain the highest education possible by attending college & serving the military and going onto leading productive and successful lives.
