



**This application is for members & family members who previously belonged to Laborers' Local 2002 and have merged with Laborers Local 773.**

The Connell F. Smith-Homer Brown Scholarship Award is presented to college students whose parents, grandparents, spouse, or who themselves are members in good standing with Laborers' Local 773.

Applicants must be enrolled as a full- time student for both FALL&SPRING semesters at an accredited University, College or Vocational School and must maintain at least a 2.6 cumulative GPA during the entire previous year to be considered for the award.

Applicants must have all forms, documents, and essay postmarked no later than July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 in order to be considered for the award. All documentation must be complete and comprehensive. Partial/incomplete applications will be omitted. Applications will not be accepted after the July 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 deadline.

Applications and essays will be reviewed by the committee beginning July 16<sup>th</sup> 2020. Recipients of the award will be notified by mail and/or email before August 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Eligibility will be conditional upon the submission of Fall-2020 class schedule which must be received before July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

Applicants must reapply each year and supply all documentation in order to become eligible or maintain eligibility. Year to year eligibility is contingent upon meeting all requirements based on the FALL-SPRING enrollment, application, cumulative GPA, essay and transcripts. Recipients who qualified can receive the award for up to 4 years (consecutive or non-consecutive).

Recipients must contribute at least one day of volunteer work for Laborers' Local 773 during each qualifying year, beginning in April 2020. This volunteer day must be completed before March 2021 in order to reapply. Any applicant who does not participate in a Union approved volunteer day will be omitted from eligibility. *\*\*First time applicants will complete a volunteer day during year one of the award and continue to contribute each year of eligibility.*

*\*ESSAY MUST MEET STANDARD GUIDELINES*

When it comes to defined retirement plans, there are two major forms that have dominated the employee benefit landscape. Those two types of benefits are the defined contribution and the defined benefit.

Today many American workers only have a defined contribution retirement plan in which the employer, employee or both make contributions on a regular basis. Individual accounts are set up for participants and benefits are based on the amounts credited to these accounts plus any investment earnings on the money in the account. Whereas many workers especially workers that are members of a Union participate in a defined benefit pension plan in which the employer negotiates a specified pension payment upon retirement that is predetermined by a formula based on several factors such as employee salary, years of service and age.
