The Connell F. Smith-Homer Brown Scholarship Award is presented to college students whose parents, grandparents, spouse, or who themselves are members in good standing with Laborers' Local 773.

This scholarship is given in honor of the late Local 773 Business Manager /Secretary Treasurer Connell F. Smith whose vision and leadership guides Local 773 today in organizing, political activism and service to the membership. The award also honors the late Homer Brown was a Local 773 Laborer in Cairo, Illinois during the Great Depression and despite his hardships he made certain his 6 children obtained their college degrees to lead productive and successful lives.

Applicants must be enrolled as a full- time student for both FALL&SPRING semesters at an accredited University, College or Vocational School and must maintain at least a 2.6 cumulative GPA during the entire previous year to be considered for the award. Proof of qualifying GPA must be in its official form.

Applicants must have all forms, documents, and essay postmarked no later than March 31st, 2023 in order to be considered for the award. All documentation must be complete and comprehensive. Partial or incomplete applications will be omitted. **Applications will not be accepted after the March 31st, 2023 deadline.**

Applications and essays will be reviewed by the committee beginning April 1st, 2023. Eligibility will be conditional upon the submission of Spring 2022/Fall-2023 class schedule. Fall2023 Schedule must be received by July 31, 2023-Spring2022 schedule must be received with the application. *(Excluding High School applicants or those applying for the first time)*

Applicants must reapply each year and supply all documentation in order to become eligible or maintain eligibility. Year to year eligibility is contingent upon meeting all requirements based on the FALL-SPRING enrollment, application, cumulative GPA, essay, volunteer day and most recent transcripts. Recipients who qualified can receive the award for up to 4 years (consecutive or non-consecutive).

Recipients must contribute at least one day of volunteer work for Laborers' Local 773 during each qualifying year, beginning in April 2023. This volunteer day must be completed before March 2024 in order to reapply. Any applicant who does not participate in a Union approved volunteer day will be omitted from eligibility. An official letter signed by the non-profit organization's supervisor must be submitted before March 31st 2024. ****First time applicants will complete a volunteer day during year one of the award and continue to contribute each year of eligibility.**

Award Recipients must be in attendance at the July 20th Union Meeting/ Award Ceremony at John A Logan College in Carterville, Illinois to receive their certificate of award. (COVID-19 Restrictions may apply)

CHECK LIST-ALL documents must be submitted in whole and applications must be complete in order to be considered for the award.

- The application must be completed in full including phone number-email and SS#-incomplete applications will be omitted
- High School or College Transcripts from the previous scholastic year must be included at time of application. **IMPORTANT**-the Cumulative GPA for the 2021-2022 school year must be clear and legible on the transcripts. Photos of transcripts or any other form of duplication not originally from the source will not be accepted.
- Proof of admission from accredited college. *Acceptance letter first year and/or class schedule thereafter.*
- Full Time Student/ 2022 spring schedule included in the application. 2023 Fall Class schedule *to be submitted before July 31st.*
- Completed Essay. Essay must be complete with 12pt font or less, 2 pages, single spaced, min. 1000 word count. *Essays that do not meet the requirements will be omitted from eligibility.*

ESSAY QUESTION

On November 8th 2022, Illinois voters passed “The Workers’ Rights Amendment”. The amendment codified Illinois workers’ right to organize and bargain collectively, while simultaneously prohibiting any law from being passed that would interfere with those rights such as any so-called “right-to-work” laws, which are designed to reduce workers’ rights and benefit big corporations.

In your own words, explain the significance of the new legislation as it relates to middle class working families in Illinois. In addition, tell us why many large corporations support “right to work” laws and back the legislation that eliminates collective bargaining. Consider why opponents of the 2022 amendment misleadingly campaigned that the amendment would drive up taxes statewide and how supporters succeeded in preserving the right to collectively bargain.
